Project Description: This project involves the issuance of Right of Entry Permit number SYW 2024 08-20 to Dr. Patrick Rohner with the University of California, San Diego for the purpose of collecting up to 60 invasive non-native dung beetles for an insect ecology research project.

This is to advise that the County of San Diego Director of Department of Parks and Recreation has approved the above described project on **8/16/2024** and found the project to be exempt from the CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt:

This project is exempt under Section 15306 of the CEQA Guidelines as the project involves the issuance of Right of Entry Permit number SYW 2024 08-20 to the University of California, San Diego for research purposes. Specifically, the collection of up to 60 invasive non-native dung beetles (*Onthophagus* sp.) from cow dung pats within and along a trail. The dung beetles will be used in an insect ecology research project and the collection will not result in serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource. Additionally, the project will not impact environmental resources of hazardous or critical concern that are designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted by government agencies; does not contribute to cumulative environmental impact; will not have a significant impact on the environment due to unusual circumstances; does not damage scenic resources within a designated state scenic highway; is not on the list of Hazardous Waste and Substance Sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and does not cause adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
