Cultural and tribal cultural resources could be impacted due to Project improvements since ground disturbances have the potential to reveal buried deposits not observed on the surface. Local tribes were contacted by the City to determine significance to the tribe. On September 5, 2024, the California Valley Miwok Tribe responded to the City's scoping letters and indicated that they understood the nature and purpose of the proposed Project and the tribe did not have any further comments or concerns.
