PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Conservation Corps of Long Beach (CCLB) will convert six early childhood YMCA of Greater Long Beach schoolyards into green schoolyards. Project activities will include the removal of approximately 1,000 square feet of concrete/asphalt, installation of 13,970 square feet of decomposed granite, 12 raised planters, nature play/learning areas, planting of 49 #15 drought tolerant and low maintenance trees, drought tolerant landscaping, and water-efficient irrigation. Corps members will be trained in construction skills, drought tolerant landscaping, tree planting, and tree maintenance.

The Department has concluded that no significant adverse environmental impacts will occur to aesthetics, agriculture and forest resources, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use planning, mineral resources, noise, populations and housing, public services, recreation, transportation and traffic, utilities and service systems, or wildfire risk.
