Project Title: OG Kush Diet LLC, Ivan Vlahov (Notification of Lake or Streambed Alteration, No. EPIMS-TRI-51999-R1)

Project Location (Shasta): The projects are located at 181 Oregon Mountain Road in Junction City; on unnamed tributaries to Slattery Gulch, in the County of Trinity. The projects are located in Section 10, Township 33N, Range 10W, Mount Diablo base and meridian, in the Weaverville U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor’s Parcel Number 024-010-044-000.

Project Description: On May 6, 2021, a draft Agreement (EPIMS-TRI-05442-R1) was issued to conditionally permit projects described within the Lake or Streambed Alteration Notification (Notification) submitted on August 15, 2019; the Agreement was contingent on the implementation of specific protection measures and issuance of a California Environmental Quality Act determination from Trinity County. On April 13, 2023, CDFW staff participated in a multi-agency site inspection. As a result of violations observed during the site inspection, CDFW issued a Notice of Violation on June 5, 2023, and subsequent letter of suspension for the draft Agreement (EPIMS-TRI-05442-R1). Four stream channels were identified to have substantial change or use of material from within bed, bank, and channel of a stream and substantial diversion or obstruction of natural flow without prior notification. On July 26, 2024, a new notification (EPIMS-TRI-51999) and Stream Restoration Plan was submitted to CDFW to remediate the violations described in the Notice of Violation. Specific work will occur as described in the Agreement, and includes, crossing upgrades, stream restoration, and revegetation.

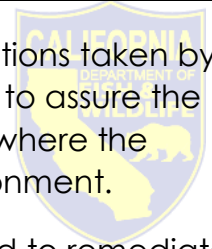
