Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project would construct a three field multi-use sports complex within a 13.5-acre site. The Youth Sports Complex would include fields that would accommodate baseball, softball, and soccer. The Youth Sports Complex would be installed east of Baldwin Lane Elementary School in the unincorporated community of Sugarloaf within San Bernardino County. Access to the Youth Sports Complex would be through an existing driveway along Baldwin Lane at the western boundary of the site. Access would be improved to include a 40' in length access road leading to a new parking area that would be adjacent to the southernmost field. The proposed project would include three backstops with associated fencing, portable toilets and 2 storage containers for equipment. The three fields will comprise approximately 250,000 SF of natural turf area. The fields will not contain nighttime lighting, as the fields will not be for utilization outside of daylight hours.

The proposed project is expected to begin construction for the sports complex in June of 2025. It is estimated that construction of the Youth Sports Complex Project will be completed by approximately October 2027. The Youth Sports Complex is intended for use by local organized youth sports leagues for games and practice.

Mitigation is required to minimize impacts under Aesthetics: (to protect trees onsite); Agriculture (to ensure compliance with the CAL FIRE through development of a Timber Harvest Plan (THP) and Timber Conversion Permit (TCP)); Biological Resources (minimizing impacts to nesting birds); Cultural Resources (minimizing impacts to any unknown buried cultural resources); Geology and Soils (prevent soil erosion/instability, ensure paleontological resources are protected upon any accidental discovery); Hazards and Hazardous Materials (remediation in the event of accidental spills); Hydrology and Water Quality (reduce stormwater runoff impacts; drainage management); Noise (minimize construction noise); Utilities and Service Systems (recycle all feasible C&D waste); and, Wildfire (ensure that the construction crew has fire prevention equipment accessible at all times to put out any accidental fires)

Notice of Intent (NOI) to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) for a NPDES general construction stormwater discharge permit. This permit is granted by submittal of an NOI to the SWRCB, but is enforced through a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) that identifies construction best management practices (BMPs) for the site. In the project area, the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board enforces the BMP requirements described in the NPDES permit by ensuring construction activities adequately implement a SWPPP. Implementation of the SWPPP is carried out by the construction contractor, with the Regional Board and County providing enforcement oversight.

Additionally, the project must comply with the San Bernardino County Fire Department, and any other responsible agency that may have discretionary authority over all or a portion of the Project.

CAL FIRE has determined that a new Timber Harvest Plan (THP) and Timber Conversion Permit (TCP) will be required for the project due to the magnitude of the changes from the previously approved THP/TCP.
