PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Santa Paula Unified School District will convert three schoolyards into nature green schoolyards in child accessible areas. Project activities will include the planting of 393 (15 gallon – 36” box) drought tolerant trees, the removal of concrete/asphalt, installation of drought tolerant landscape areas, stormwater gardens, addition of two outdoor classrooms, nature-based play structures, expanded access and site circulation through natural paths and permeable pavement, and water efficient irrigation.

The Department has concluded that no significant adverse environmental impacts will occur to aesthetics, agriculture and forest resources, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use planning, mineral resources, noise, populations and housing, public services, recreation, transportation and traffic, utilities and service systems, or wildfire risk.
