Caltrans proposes to improve roadway drainage and reduce erosion at two unnamed drainage locations that do not convey natural flow, but rather roadway runoff from the town of Lee Vining and U.S. Route 395 via drainage inlets. Rock-slope protection will be replaced at the culvert outfall and channel at location 1. The culverts will remain in place. At location 2, the culvert will be removed and replaced in-kind with the same sized pipe and new rock slope protection will be installed at the culvert outfall.
