**PROJECT TITLE:** Erecting Shop Roof and Window Repair

**LOCATION:** Old Sacramento State Historic Park

**COUNTY:** Sacramento

**DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:**

This project will replace or restore 9 original windows; replace and repair fire damaged roofing infrastructure, and replace missing corrugated roofing on the erecting shop building adjacent to Old Sacramento State Historic Park to protect the building and allow for continued use for park maintenance activities.

The project will:

- Inventory and remove existing complete sashes, sash rails, stiles, muntins, and glass panes from nine (9) openings within a fire damaged area;
- Restore five (5) windows using like/in-kind construction techniques and materials;
- Fabricate four (4) missing sashes to match existing in material and construction;
- Remove damaged existing corrugated metal roof panels. Retain any panels deemed salvageable and properly dispose of those that are not;
- Inspect the wooden trusses in the burned area. Use metal plates to repair the damaged trusses as indicated in engineer's assessment.
- Install shoring beams to support damaged trusses, and replace any previously installed shoring beams if necessary;
- Replace two (2) rows of purlins in the burned roof area to ensure a smooth nailing strip for installation of the new corrugated metal roof;
- Inspect and replace additional purlins as needed to create a uniform and balanced surface for the installation of new 22-gauge corrugated roof panels with installation consistent with original construction methods;
- Install flashings and battens to provide a secure watertight fit; and
- Install the nine (9) new and restored sashes under guidance of the Restoration Supervisor.

All work will be done in accordance with the Secretary of Interior Standards for Rehabilitation of Historic Structures.

**REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT:**

The project consists of the operation, repair, maintenance or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond current levels, replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced and is included as "Reroofing" in the Department of Parks and Recreation's list of exempt activities, in accordance with CCR §15300.4; and consists of projects limited to maintenance, repair, stabilization, rehabilitation, restoration, preservation, conservation or reconstruction of historical resources in a manner consistent with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties with Guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, and Reconstructing Historic Buildings (1995), Weeks and Grimmer.
