Project Description

Project Title: Santa Ana Watershed (Post-Fire Advanced Emergency Protection Measures in the Line Fire Scarred Areas)

Project Location: The Line fire -affected flood facilities include Elder Creek Basin, Elder Creek Channel, Plunge Creek, Oak Creek Channel, City Creek, Seven Oaks Dam and its access roads, specifically Alder Creek Road, all located in the City of Highland. Additionally, within the City of San Bernardino, Cook Canyon Channel is also affected.

Project Description: On September 5, 2024, the Line Fire ignited in San Bernardino County, burning approximately 43,978 acres and is still not fully contained. A Governor Proclaimed State of Emergency has been declared for San Bernardino County. Emergency work involves clearing basins, channels, and culverts of trees, vegetation, sediment, and debris; repairing inverts and slopes; repairing erosions and damage to flood facilities and their access roads; and restoring capacity to enhance public safety from post-fire damage and anticipated future impacts.
