POCK LANE IMPROVEMENTS

Project Description

Project Location:

Pock Lane: 1,154 feet south of Carpenter Road to 200 feet north of Eleventh Street. **See attached Vicinity Map.**

Project Justification:

Pock Lane's construction date is unknown. The roadway was resurfaced in 1971 with a 0.25-foot layer of Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) and widened in 2001 to a 22-foot-wide road, featuring a 4-foot paved shoulder on the west side between Carpenter Road and Loomis Road. The road was resurfaced again with 0.25-foot HMA from 128 feet south of Stockton City Limits to Loomis Road. In 2002, the east side of the road from 130 feet south of Stockton City Limits to Carpenter Road was widened to include a 4-foot paved shoulder, along with the installation of storm drain inlets and pipes to maintain drainage.

Currently, the road within the project limits shows significant wear, with numerous asphalt concrete patches, pavement failures, and extensive alligator cracking and rutting. The section south of Carpenter Road has a high concentration of alligator cracking and patching, resulting in an Overall Condition Index (OCI) rating of 31. The segment north of Carpenter Road exhibits a substantial amount of alligator/block cracking and rutting, with an OCI rating of 40.

Scope of Work:

The project will consist of:

1. Grinding and removing existing asphalt concrete (AC) to a depth of 0.25 feet and placing 0.25 feet HMA (Type A) from south end of the project to the Carpenter Road (S) intersection.
2. Placing 0.25 feet HMA overlay from Carpenter Road (N) intersection to the Duck Creek bridge deck.
3. Grinding and removing existing AC to a depth of 0.25 feet and placing 0.25 feet HMA from the Duck Creek bridge deck to approximately 160 feet south of Loomis Road (right lane only).
4. Repairing pavement structural failure areas to a depth of 0.25 feet [HMA (Type A)] beneath the grind & replacing section south of Carpenter Road, with a total repair depth of 0.50 feet. Full depth 0.50 feet HMA (Type A) pavement repairs from Carpenter Road (N) to the north project limit.
5. Placing shoulder backing (3 feet wide at an 8% slope) along the west side of the roadway from south end of the project to Carpenter Road (S), and 2 feet wide on the east side from Carpenter Road (N) to 30 feet south of the Duck Creek bridge deck.
6. Constructing approx. 3,650 feet of 4-foot-wide Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) Walkway on west side of Pock Lane and the south side of Loomis Road.
7. Constructing approximately 2,100 feet of HMA Dike (Type A) along the west side of the existing EP from Carpenter Road (N) intersection to approximately 45 feet south of the Duck Creek bridge deck.
8. Reconstructing 6 to 8-foot HMA Driveways (Type D) from back of new PCC walkway to Right-of-Way line.
9. Constructing new drainage ditch and install new 12-foot Corrugated Steel Pipe (CSP) cross drains at all driveways.

Project Description

10. Supplying Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant detectable walking surfaces at the ends of walkways at each intersection.
11. Constructing a curb ramp to connect the new PCC walkway to the existing curb, gutter, and sidewalk in the City of Stockton Right-of-Way at the south end of the project.
12. Isolated areas of Pock Lane north of Loomis Road will receive pavement repair only (0.50 feet).

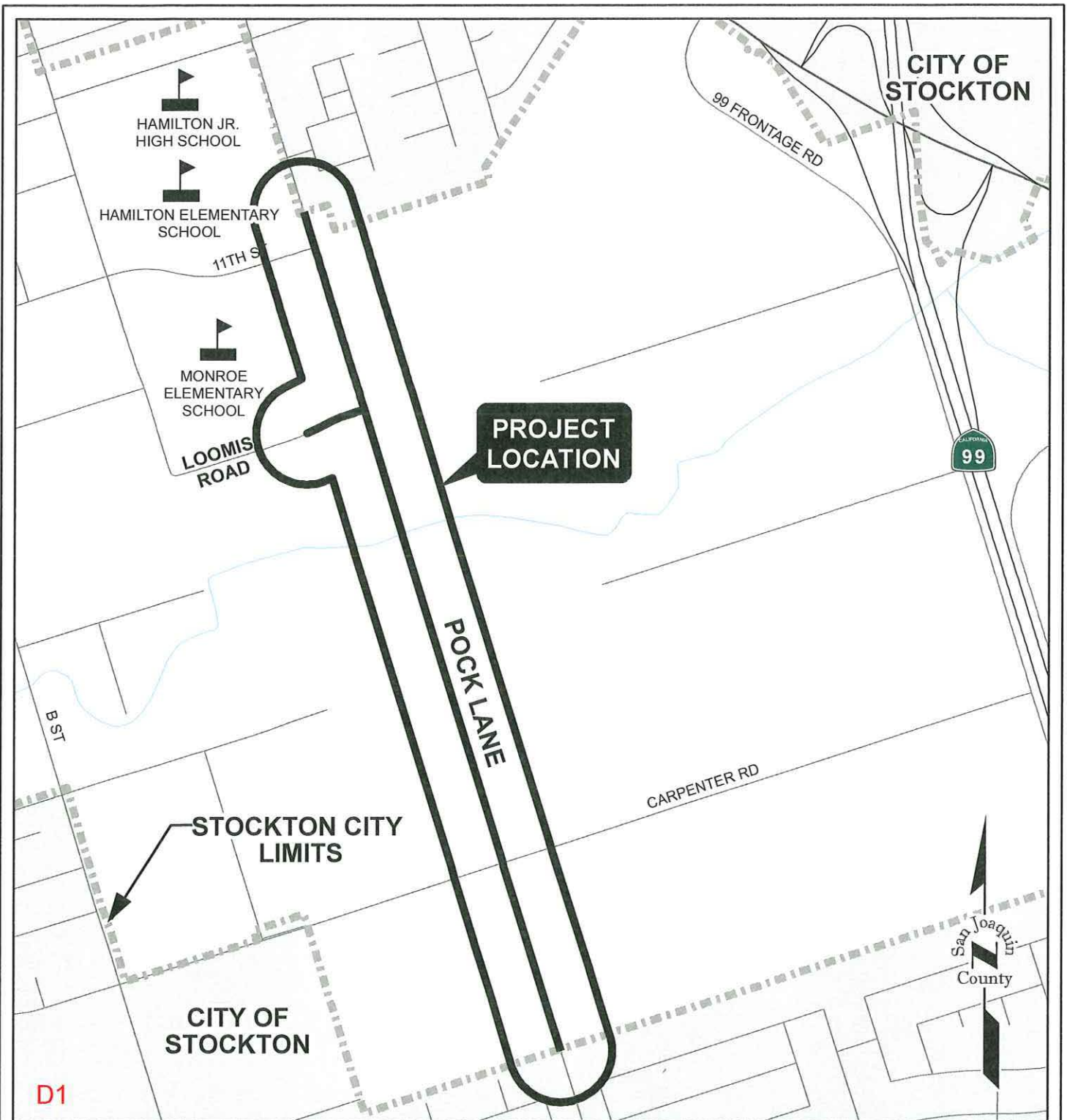
Environmental Setting:

In these portions of the San Joaquin County, land usage is primarily **suburban with single family homes**.

There are many large trees adjacent to the project area. Nesting and migratory birds, protected by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, may nest within these trees. Furthermore, the Swainson's Hawk, a raptor species of concern within the State of California and listed as threatened may nest adjacent to or within the project area. A pre-construction survey for nesting Swainson's Hawks and other migratory birds is recommended if construction is scheduled to occur from February 15th to September 1st.

Beneficiaries:

The public will see increased safety and fewer hazards with this well-maintained road. Overall, there will be reduced maintenance concerns and more reliability within the project area.
