Project Title: Cannon Street Widening Project

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project would widen the Cannon Street roadway within the project limits to accommodate a third northbound lane from approximately 500 feet north of Santiago Canyon Road to Serrano Avenue where it would join the two existing dedicated right-turn lanes to eastbound Serrano Avenue in order to improve traffic operations. South of Santiago Creek, additional pavement would be constructed to the east to widen the roadway to meet minimum standard horizontal curve radii. North of Santiago Creek, the roadway would be widened to the west by approximately 6 feet. In the southbound direction, bicyclists and pedestrians would cross Santiago Creek on a new bridge just west of the existing vehicular bridge consisting of a prefabricated steel truss, approximately 170 feet long and 12 feet wide. Existing pavement delineation would be reconfigured and portions of the painted median would be replaced with a raised landscaped median. A traffic signal modification is required at Taft Avenue. Temporary construction easements would be needed from the County of Orange to construct the new pedestrian bridge. A portion of the widening would be outside of the City of Orange's jurisdiction and within the City of Villa Park.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The proposed project would potentially have significant impacts to biological resources, tribal cultural resources, paleontological resources, and cultural resources. However, any potentially significant impacts would be reduced so less than significant with the implementation of Mitigation Measures BIO-1 through BIO-6, TCR-1 through TCR-3, GEO-1 through GEO 2, and CUL-1 as detailed further in the Draft IS/MND.

If applicable, describe any of the project's areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency, including issues raised by agencies and the public.

There are no areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency regarding the proposed project. The Draft IS/MND will be released for a 30-day public circulation period from October 31, 2024 to November 30, 2024. During this time, feedback from stakeholder agencies and the public will be gathered regarding any questions related to the environmental analysis presented in the Draft IS/MND. A public hearing will also be held in order to capture any comments or concerns from the public regarding the proposed Project. Any areas of controversy regarding the environmental analysis presented in the Draft IS/MND will be adequately addressed and formally addressed in the project's Final IS/MND once it is prepared.
