Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project is located approximately 14 miles northwest of Adin off of County Road 85A on the Shaw Ranch along the Pit River. The current mining area and proposed expansion area are located in Section 35, Township 41 North, Range 7 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian (MDBM). The latitude and longitude at the center of the project are 41° 20'36.46"N and 121° 08'02.73"W, respectively.

Hat Creek Construction propose to continue operating under the original conditions outlined in the Use Permit/ Reclamation Plan 96-52 on APN 010-420-17. The proposed project is a request to amend Use Permit/Reclamation Plan 96-52 to include: 1) an approximately 7-acre expansion, 2) a revised removal volume, and 3) extension of the end date to 2050.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The proposed project would result in a potentially significant effects related to biological resources, cultural/Tribal cultural resources. Dust control measures in accordance with Modoc County APCD requirements would be implemented to reduce concentrations of criteria air pollutants during construction. One mitigation measure is proposed to reduce biological impacts to less than significant levels (preconstruction nest surveys). Mitigation measures are provided for the inadvertent discovery of of cultural resources, including evidence of human burial or human remains.
