BACKGROUND:

The Applicant was issued Temporary Approval by DCR with an effective date of March 4, 2024. Since that time, the Applicant has adhered to the requirements of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) and DCR's Rules and Regulations, and completed all requirements for the issuance of an Annual License. The Applicant currently possesses a State provisional License, C10-0001330-LIC, to conduct Retail with on-site sales Commercial Cannabis Activity, which is active through June 21, 2025. The Applicant is subject to the requirements of LAMC Section 104.20 for the Social Equity Program. The Business Premises is located at 6218 - 6228 Lankershim Blvd., North Hollywood, CA 91606, a parcel zoned for Neighborhood Office Commercial purposes.

Social Equity Applications are evaluated for compliance with the Equity Share requirements under LAMC 104.20. To comply with the Equity Share requirements, Social Equity Individual Applicants (SEIAs) must possess unrestricted ownership of their share of the Social Equity Applicant (business), a proportional right to vote and to the profits, and include certain language mandated by LAMC 104.20 in their agreements, among other requirements. As part of the application process, DCR reviewed the corporate and ownership documentation provided for this Applicant and determined that the Applicant met the minimum Equity Share requirements at that time.

DEPARTMENT ANNUAL LICENSING RECOMMENDATION:

DCR recommends approving the Annual License for the Applicant based on the following factors:

- The Applicant has met the Application requirements under LAMC Section 104.03.
- The Business Premises location meets the requirements under LAMC Section 105.02.
- The Application does not contain any grounds for denial under LAMC Section 104.04.
- The Applicant has met the requirements under LAMC Section 104.20.

COMMUNITY INPUT:

On or about August 8, 2024, DCR provided notice of the community meeting and Cannabis Regulation Commission meeting by mail to the owners and occupants of all property within 700 feet of the property line of the Business Premises. Notice was also provided to the nearest Neighborhood Council, Business Improvement District, and Council Office.

The virtual community meeting was held on August 29, 2024. During the meeting, members of the public were afforded two minutes each to speak about the Application. DCR also accepted online written input through the date of the community meeting. In general, the oral and written comments provided by the public were concerned about its proximity to a school, and the applicant's agent spoke of the record's compliance and readiness to serve the community.

The Applicant provided timely proof to DCR that it contacted the nearest Neighborhood Council and offered to appear before the Neighborhood Council in accordance with LAMC Section 104.06(b)(1)(ii).

COMPLAINT PORTAL:

In March 2024 DCR received a complaint regarding a grand opening event at the location which advertised entertainment, DJ, prizes, food and giveaways. CED staff investigated the complaint and verified that at least on one occasion the Licensee held a special or temporary event on its Business Premises which included a DJ, games and entertainment with outdoor speakers. Consequently, the Licensee was issued a Notice of Violation (NOV) with monetary fines. As of the date of this memo, the Licensee admitted to committing the violations stated in the NOV regarding the special event/party and has agreed to pay a fine which was due on August 29, 2024. After payment is made and processed by the Office of Finance, the NOV will be closed.

COMPLIANCE REVIEW:

As part of its progressive enforcement strategy, DCR performs compliance checks and/or inspections of Applicants and Licensees for operational compliance under the Rules and Regulations for Cannabis Procedures ("Regulations"). There are at least 85 potential violations in the Regulations. For most of these violations, DCR's compliance program aims to provide Licensees with the opportunity to cure before facing significant penalties, denial, suspension, or revocation. DCR's discovery of violations of the Regulations may result in a Notice to Correct ("NTC"), Notice of Violation ("NOV") with administrative penalties, Notice of Suspension ("NOS"), Notice of Revocation ("NOR"), or Notice of Administrative Hold, depending on the severity of the findings. (LAMC § 104.13.)

In most circumstances, when a violation is discovered, DCR's first step is to issue a NTC. If, after the issuance of a NTC, an applicant does not correct violations, DCR may issue a NOV with significant administrative penalties. (LAMC § 104.013(c)(2).) Failure to comply with a NOV may result in a second escalating NOV, denial of a License renewal, imposition of more restrictive License conditions or suspension or revocation of a license. (LAMC §§ 104.13(d)(5), 104.13(e)(2).) DCR may also immediately suspend a business without a hearing if there is an imminent threat to life or public safety, the Applicant operates without all necessary permits or clearances from another agency, or the Applicant does not have an active State license for that Commercial Cannabis Activity.

For this Applicant, DCR performed a compliance check of the Business Premises on or about August 21, 2024. During the compliance check, DCR discovered a number of minor/moderate violations, including:

Regulation 5(A)(1)(viii) - Use of DBA. Licensee has not submitted documentation to DCR regarding the use of "STIIIZY North Hollywood" as a Fictitious Business Name (FBN) or DBA. (VT - Minor)

Regulation 5(A)(2)(i) - Display of License. The designated Neighborhood Liaison contact information on-site, is different from the contact information on file with DCR and the email address of the Neighborhood Liaison is not provided. Additionally, the Licensee could not produce their BTRC which must be posted publicly. (VT - Minor)

Regulation 5(A)(4)(i)(C) - Security Measures The timestamp displayed on the video surveillance recording is approximately one hour behind the actual time.(VT - Moderate)

Regulation No.5(A)(4)(iv) - Alarm System. The Licensee does not have the required Alarm System Permit pursuant to LAMC Section 103.206.

Regulation 5(A)(6)(iv) - Loitering. The "No Loitering, Public Drinking, or Public Smoking/Consumption of Cannabis" sign(s) is/are not posted on the inside/outside of the Business Premises.

The Licensee's representative was debriefed by DCR following the inspection and was informed of the deficiencies found

As a result, DCR issued a NTC to the Applicant on August 26, 2024. The Applicant has 30 days to correct the violations and/or deficiencies listed in the NTC. DCR anticipates the Applicant will continue to be forthcoming and cooperative, but reserves the right to take escalating enforcement action, if necessary.

Therefore, it is DCR's position that this compliance check did not reveal any serious concerns that impacted DCR's ability to recommend this Applicant for licensure. The violations may be remedied within 30 days without jeopardizing public safety. Moreover, this Applicant shall be subject to multiple, further inspections by DCR and other agencies prior to the receipt of an Operating Permit.

THERE ARE NO EXISTING REASONS TO DENY AN ANNUAL LICENSE:

DCR or the Cannabis Regulation Commission may deny an Annual Application for the reasons stated in LAMC section 104.04. These denial reasons include, but are not limited, to:

- The Business Premises is substantially different from the diagram of the Business Premises submitted by the Applicant or Licensee;
- Denying DCR employees or agents access to the Business Premises;
- Procuring a License by fraud or deceit, making a material misrepresentation, false statement, or knowingly failing to disclose a material fact;
- Failing to timely to provide DCR with requested information, forms or documents;

- Denial of a license, permit or other authorization to engage in Commercial Cannabis Activity by any state or other local licensing authority;
- Creation a significant public safety problem as documented by a law enforcement agency;
- Failure to adhere to the requirements of this article or the Rules and Regulations;
- Engaging in unlicensed Commercial Cannabis Activity in violation of Section 104.15;
- Revocation of Temporary Approval;
- Failing a Business Premises inspection by DCR, another City agency, or the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health; or
- Failing to comply with any requirement in LAMC Section 104.20;
- The Business Premises was the site of a utility disconnect, padlocking or certain criminal convictions for a period of 5 years from the date of the conviction, padlock or disconnect;
- Improper zoning or distancing of the Business Premises from Sensitive Uses under LAMC Section 105.00 et seq.;
- An Owner is an individual who holds office in, is employed by any agency of the State of California and any
 of its political subdivisions when the individual's duties include the enforcement or regulation of Commercial
 Cannabis Activity or any other penal provisions of law of the State of California prohibiting or regulating
 Commercial Cannabis Activity; and,
- An Owner is an entity incorporated outside of the United States.

At present, DCR is not aware of any existing facts or circumstances to deny this Annual License for the reasons in LAMC Section 104.04. Thus, DCR recommends the Commission approve the issuance of this Annual License.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Applicant seeks conversion of an existing Retail Storefront (Type 10) Temporary Approval to an Annual License to be located on an existing site zoned for Neighborhood Office Commercial, C2-1VL at 6218 - 6228 Lankershim Blvd., North Hollywood, CA 91606 (Assessor's Parcel Number 2335-030-021). The Project-Specific Information (LIC-4013-FORM) submitted by the Applicant states that existing structures will remain with no expansion proposed (Exhibit A). Existing City sewer service is provided to the project site, and water and electricity are provided by the City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power. Operations would be seven days per week from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Pre-application review has found the project to be consistent with planning and zoning. Further project site information is provided in the Project Parcel Profile Report from the City's Zone Information and Map Access System (ZIMAS) (Exhibit A). Compliance with Los Angeles Municipal Code Sections 104.00 et seq. and 105.00 et seq., as well as DCR's Rules and Regulations, does not waive or otherwise circumvent any other City or State requirements or necessary permits from the City, State, or other public agencies, such as the Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety, the Los Angeles Fire Department, or the Los Angeles County Public Health Department. Full compliance with all applicable regulations for the proposed cannabis use(s) are assumed in this analysis.

CEQA PROJECT ANALYSIS & FINDINGS:

Land Use/Zoning Designations

Neighborhood Office Commercial /C2-1VL

Surrounding Land Use/Zoning Designations

Neighborhood Office Commercial /C2-1VL Neighborhood Office Commercial / R3-1

Subject Property

The subject site is a fully developed lot within the North Hollywood - Valley Village Community Plan Area. The lot is approximately 99 feet deep and a width of 211 feet along Lankershim Blvd.. The site is currently developed with a Commercial - Auto, Recreation Equipment, Construction Equipment Sales and Service - Auto Body Repair Shop - One Story building, built in 1976 proposed to be maintained.

The site has a Neighborhood Office Commercial land-use designation and is zoned C2-1VL. The site is located within Council District CD 2, NoHo Neighborhood Council, the lot is flat and contains a pre-existing building to be used by the Applicant.

Abutting Properties

Abutting uses include commercial uses within 200 feet of the site. The immediate area along Lankershim Blvd. is predominantly developed with Neighborhood Office Commercial uses, zoned C2-1VL, and Neighborhood Office Commercial, zoned R3-1. (See Exhibit A)

CEQA Findings

CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15301 & 15332, Class 1 & Class 32, consists of projects characterized as in-fill development meeting the following 5 conditions: (a) The project is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable general plan policies as well as with the applicable zoning designation and regulations; (b) The proposed development occurs within city limits on a project site of no more than five acres substantially surrounded by urban uses; (c) The project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; (d) Approval of the project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality; and (e) The site can be adequately served by all required utilities and public services.

These conditions are met as follows: The project is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable general plan policies as well as with the applicable zoning designation and regulations for the requested commercial cannabis activities.

- a) The site is comprised of one lot totaling approximately 21,068 gross square feet, zoned C2-1VL with a Commercial Auto, Recreation Equipment, Construction Equipment Sales and Service Auto Body Repair Shop One Story building originally constructed in 1976. No relief has been requested from any applicable provision or requirement of the Los Angeles Municipal Code.
- b) The subject site is wholly within the City of Los Angeles, on an approximately 21,068 gross square foot property (i.e., less than five acres), and is substantially surrounded by urban uses. The surrounding area is zoned Neighborhood Office Commercial, and developed with commercial buildings along Lankershim Blvd. between Victory Blvd. and Erwin St..
- c) The project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species. The project is located within an established, fully developed, neighborhood. The project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species. The project does not propose the removal of any trees on-site and/or within the adjacent public right-of-way.
- d) Approval of the project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality.
- e) The site can be adequately served by all required utilities and public services. The project site will be adequately served by all required public utilities and services, given that the site is currently served by the City's Department of Water and Power, the City's Bureau of Sanitation, the Southern California (SoCal) Gas Company, the Los Angeles Police Department, the Los Angeles Fire Department, Los Angeles Unified School District, Los Angeles Public Library, and other public services. Compliance with Regulatory Compliance Measures as enforced through the Department of Building and Safety permitting process will ensure that any needed improvements are made in order to provide adequate delivery of utilities and services to the proposed project.

CEQA Section 15300.2: Exceptions to the Use of Categorical Exemptions. The City has further considered whether the proposed project is subject to any of the exceptions set forth in State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2, that would prohibit the use and reliance on the categorical exemptions. None of the exceptions are triggered. As the proposed project will result in no physical changes to the site, the project would not have physical impacts to the environment. As such, it would not have a combined impact with other projects in the area that would result in cumulative impacts. There are no unusual circumstances associated with the project, which is proposed in general plan designation and zoning classification that allow the proposed use. The project will not physically change the site or the existing structures. Therefore, the project would have no impact on scenic resources, historic building(s), and the site is not on the lists that satisfy Government Code Section 65962.5, commonly referred to as the "Cortese List," as being affected by hazardous wastes or clean-up problems.

Based on the analysis above, the proposed project is consistent with the criteria for Class 1 and Class 32 categorical exemptions (tit. 14, Cal. Code Regs., §§ 15301, 15332) and does not require further analysis based on the exceptions in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2, and thus, DCR finds that no further CEQA analysis is required.

In conclusion, since the project meets all of the requirements for categorical exemption as set forth at CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15301 & 15332, and none of the applicable exceptions to the use of an exemption apply to the project, it is appropriate to determine this project is categorically exempt from the requirements of CEQA.

DEPARTMENT OF CANNABIS REGULATION RECOMMENDED ACTIONS:

That the Cannabis Regulation Commission:

- 1. Determine, based on the whole of the administrative record, that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Section 15301, Class 1, and Article 19, Section 15332, Class 32 of the State CEQA Guidelines (tit. 14, Cal. Code Regs., §§ 15301, 15332), and there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to a categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 applies;
- 2. Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 104.06(b)(2), approve the Annual License for Type 10 Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Activity at the Business Premises location; and,

3. Adopt DCR's Project Analysis & Findings as the Commission's report on the subject.

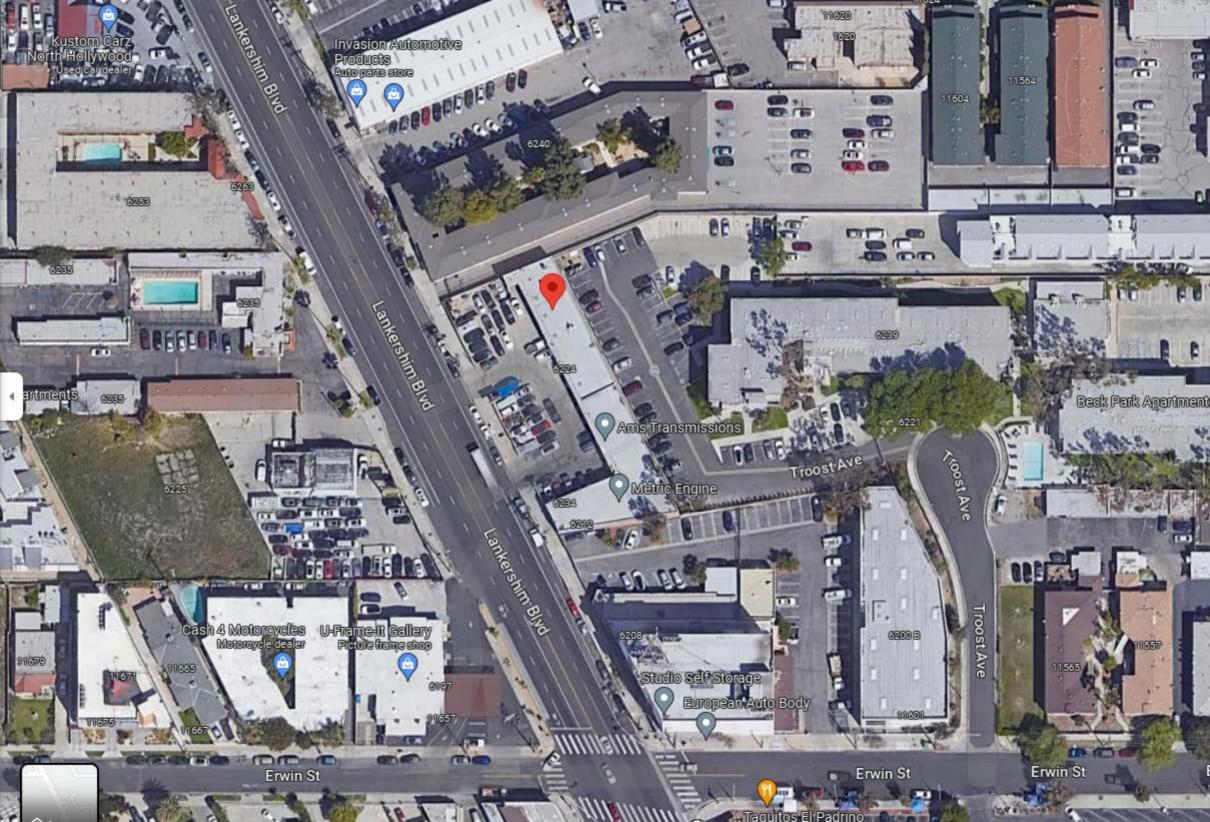

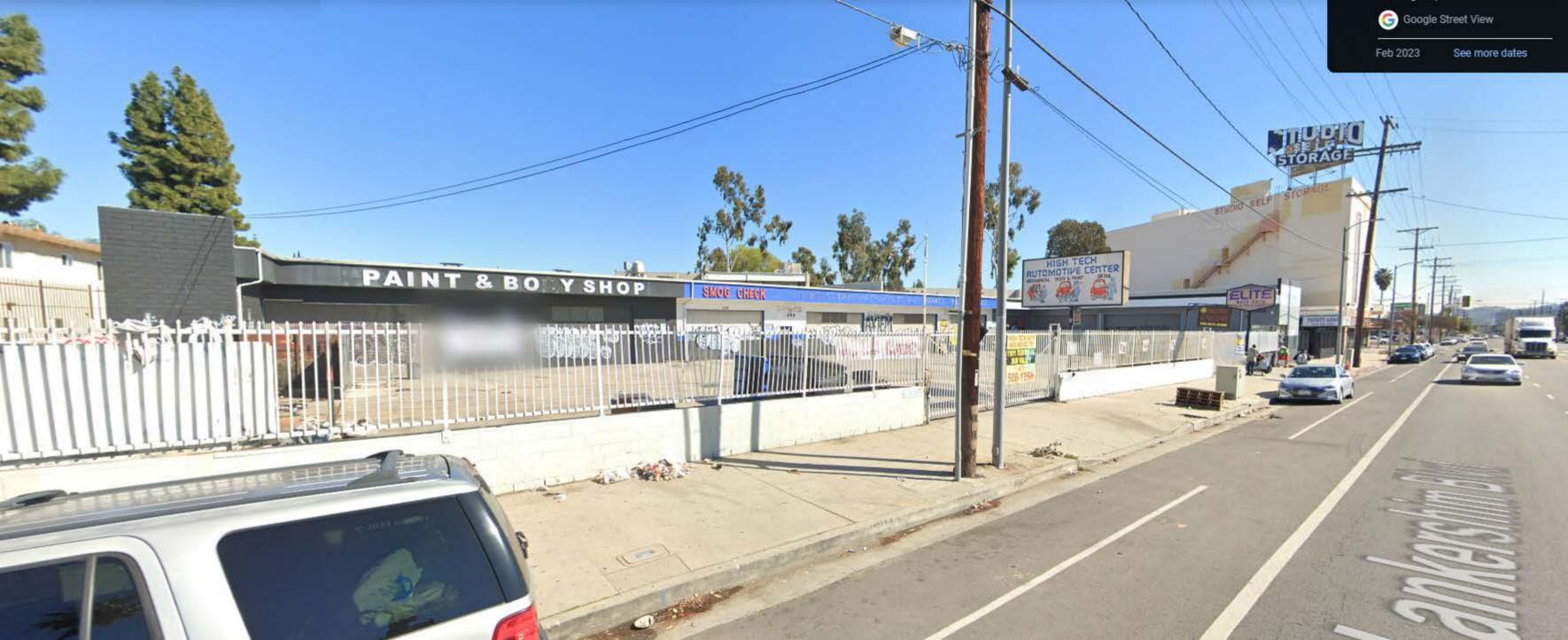

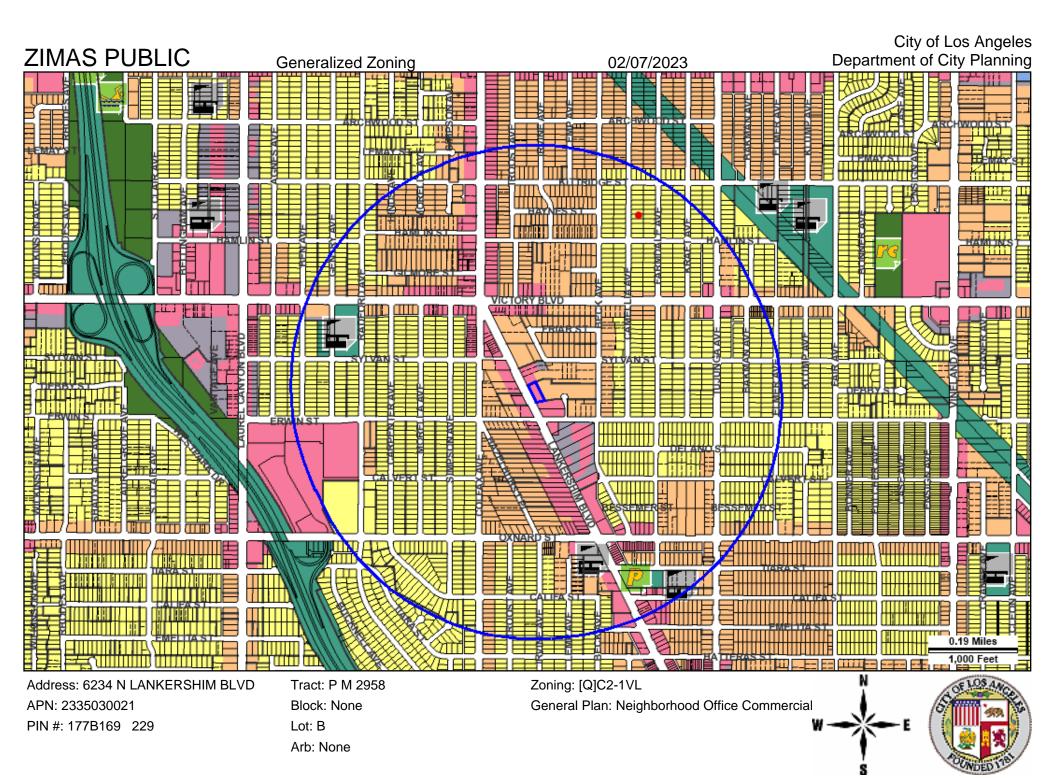
