Staff's analysis demonstrated that the project does not have the potential to degrade the quality of the environment or impact biological resources. The project would not impact the riparian habitat along Redwood Creek or any potential associated vegetation or species, as the physical improvements of the project are located more than 100 feet from the creek, at the closest. On the winery parcel, the proposed physical improvements are in an already developed area and the proposed well location is more than 500 feet from the creek and separated by Redwood Road. Groundwater resources were evaluated and potential impacts were determined to be less than significant, as the estimated groundwater recharge potential is greater than the proposed water use associated with the project.
