The California Department of Transportation issued a District Director’s Order to repair a HVAC system in Sacramento County on Interstate 50 at Post Mile 2.13. The proposed work consists of replacing the non-functional and obsolete HVAC system control panel components, electrical components, chiller and boiler repairs, new exhaust, and ventilation components for the mission critical laboratories that will interface with the new HVAC system, further troubleshooting of the non-functioning HVAC system within the building and design work required for its repair, and incidental work.
