NOTICE OF EXEMPTION SHASTA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE SOUTH COUNTY PATROL & EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTER SHASTA COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed action consists of minor site work to reduce fire risk to the existing Emergency Operation Center at 6590 Lockheed Drive in Redding, California and to provide space for a metal building to house the Sheriff's emergency operation equipment. Alterations to the existing site include an extension of the existing perimeter security fence, removal of vegetation less than 8-inch diameter, grading for a new access road and a new metal storage building.

PURPOSE AND NEED FOR ACTION

The proposed project will reduce wildfire risk at the Shasta County Sheriff's Office South County Patrol & Emergency Operation Center (EOC). The project will also allow the Sheriff to relocate emergency operation equipment currently stored off site. This will improve emergency response times and reduce operational costs.

The project must undergo CEQA review as a government-sponsored project.

PROJECT LOCATION

The project site is located near the Redding Municipal Airport in southeast Redding, near the intersection of Lockheed Drive and Knighton Road, in Shasta County, California. The address of the site is 6590 Lockheed Drive, Redding, California, Assessor Parcel Number (APN) 054-280-008. The project site is located within the Enterprise, CA USGS 7.5-minute quadrangle, Section 27, Township 31N, Range 4W, MDBM. The latitude and longitude of the site are 40.51038 and -122.30341, respectively. The general project location is shown on Figure 1.

FINDING THAT THE PROJECT IS EXEMPT

The project falls under categorical Exemption 15304 as defined in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Chapter 3, Article 19, Section 15304, *Minor Alterations to Land*. Class 4 projects are defined as:

Class 4 consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes.

Grading on land is limited to locations with a slope of less than 10 percent and cannot occur in a waterway or any wetland. The exemption specifically addresses and approves work completed for fuel management activities within 30 feet of structures to reduce the volume of flammable vegetation so long as the work does not result in the taking of endangered, rare, or threatened plant or animal species or significant erosion and sedimentation of surface waters.

The project, as proposed and designed, meets the requirements and intent of this exemption.
