Project Title: Grant Avenue/State Route 128/Russell Boulevard Bike and Pedestrian Improvements Project

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The City of Winters (City), in cooperation with Yolo County and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), is proposing to construct complete streets improvements from the intersection of Morgan Street and Grant Avenue/SR 128 in Winters to Russell Boulevard/CR 32 and Fredricks Drive in unincorporated Yolo County. Roadway improvements would include curb, gutter, sidewalk, and Americans with Disabilities (ADA) curb ramp improvements, as well as storm drain modifications, paving, striping, and sign installation. Project implementation would provide a dedicated pedestrian and bicycle facility across interstate 505. The project is determined to result in potentially significant impacts to Biological, Cultural, Hazards/Hazardous Materials, and Tribal Cultural Resources. However, with the incorporation of project-specific mitigation measures, any potentially significant impacts resulting from the project would be reduced to a less than significant level.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project is anticipated to have a less than significant impacts on biological resources, cultural resources, hazards and hazardous waste, and tribal cultural resources with mitigation measures incorporated. Mitigation includes the following:
Biological measures: BIO-1, BMP's to reduce erosion and protect water quality, through BIO-12, implement Yolo HCP/NCCP Swainson's Hawk Covered Species AMMs, where applicable.
Cultural measures: CR-1 and CR-2, which states if an inadvertent discovery of cultural materials or human remains is discovered, work must cease and the appropriate professionals notified.
Hazards/Hazardous Materials measures: HAZ-1, Existing concrete structures to be inspected prior to impacts, through HAZ-4, soils adjacent to agricultural land to be inspected.
Tribal Cultural measures: CR-1 and CR-2, as listed above in Cultural measures.
