NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT NEGATIVE DECLARATION

Notice is hereby given that the City of Stockton has prepared an Initial Study (IS) of environmental effects and intends to adopt a Negative Declaration (ND) for the Main Street/Market Street Precise Road Plan project. The City of Stockton is the Lead Agency for this project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The project proposes to adopt a Precise Road Plan for an approximately 2.75-mile segment of Main Street from Hunter Street to Broadway Avenue and an approximately 1.25-mile segment of Market Street from Center Street to Main Street. The Precise Road Plan would guide future reconfiguration of vehicle lanes, parking, bicycle and pedestrian facilities on these segments to provide Complete Streets.

The IS/ND analyzes the potential environmental effects of the project in accordance with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. Based on this analysis, the IS/MND finds that the project will not involve any significant environmental effects. There are no sites identified under Section 65962.5 of the Government Code located on or near the project site.
