Project Title: Enschede Road (Doberman Rescue) Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement, No. EPIMS-VEN-24592-R5)

Project Location (Ventura County): The Project is located within Lord Creek, in the County of Ventura, State of California; Latitude 34.413162, Longitude -118.965314; Assessor's Parcel Number 041-0-150-030.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has extended Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification No. EPIMS-VEN-24592-R5, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Southern California Edison (Permittee) as represented by Hazem Gabr.

The Project involves the maintenance of vegetation to a set distance from Southern California Edison (SCE) owned and operated power lines. The Project will take place along a portion of SCE's 220kV Santa Clara-Vincent, 220kV Pardee-Santa Clara, 66kV Idle Santa Clara-P.S. 11, and 66kV Santa Clara-Wakefield No. 2 circuits. This extension changed the initial expiration date of the Streambed Alteration Agreement from February 24, 2024, to February 24, 2026. This extension also included conditions to the original Streambed Alteration Agreement in the form of revisions to the project's permanent impacts being lessened from 1.08 acres to 0.847 acres, with the addition of 0.117 acres of temporary impacts. This also resulted in the reduction to the required letter of credit amount associated with the mitigation of the project's permanent impacts. Reasons why Project is exempt: The Project consists of the maintenance of vegetation to maintain set clearance distances with SCE's power lines. No expansion of use is proposed. The Project is exempt because it involves the maintenance of existing structures and/or facilities and involves fuel management activities within 30 feet of structures to reduce the volume of flammable vegetation.
