Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

A request by the County of San Luis Obispo to approve amendments to County Code Title 1 General Provisions for cannabis violation correction period, Title 22 and Title 23 Land Use Ordinances for Shandon Habitat buffer and limitations on garage sizes for accessory dwelling units (LRP2024-00011). All Districts.

Exempt Status/Findings: This project is covered by the common-sense exemption that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The County of San Luis Obispo determines that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment; the activity is not subject to CEQA. The proposed amendments consist of changes ensuring consistency between regulations, applying development restrictions within the Shandon Habitat Buffer consistent with the original intent, and applying development standards limiting ADU garage sizes. Therefore, the proposed activity qualifies for the common-sense

exemption under CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061 (b)(3), thus no further environmental review is required.
