Project Description

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to replace Right of Way fences along Westbound on State Route (SR) 580 at postmile 4.0 to 6.5 in San Joaquin County. The current fences are damaged and will be replaced with metal post, barbed wire, mesh fences. All work will be within Caltrans Right of Way. The purpose of the project is to address the deteriorated and nonfunctional right of way fencing. The project is needed to prevent unauthorized access to Caltrans Right of Way

General:

- Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact the Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources are discovered.
- Contact the Environmental Office to attend the pre-construction meeting.

Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
 2. Protect the discovery area
 3. Notify the Engineer
 4. The Department Investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Biology:

- Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-10.01 shall be included in the contract. All food related trash items such as wrappers, cans, bottles, and food scraps will be disposed of in closed containers and removed daily from the construction site.
- Caltrans SSP 10-1.03 shall be included in the contract. All work will be restricted from post mile 4.0 to post mile 6.5 from sunset to sunrise.
- Caltrans SSP 14-6.03A shall be included in the contract and implemented as follows for SJKF:

Within PM 4.0 to 4.45 and within PM 5.8 to 6.5, implement the following protection measures:

 1. A qualified Caltrans biologist must conduct a pre-construction SJKF survey from PM 4.0 to 4.45 and PM 5.8 to 6.5 to determine the presence of atypical, known, or natal/pupping dens prior to activities that involve ground disturbance. If work doesn't begin within 14 days of the cleared pre-construction surveys, follow-up surveys will need to be conducted prior to the start of construction related activities.
 2. If a potential, atypical, known, or natal/pupping den is discovered during the pre-construction survey, a protective buffer radius will be established around the den. No construction related activities shall occur within the limits of the protective buffer until authorized by the Caltrans District 10 (D10) Environmental Office.



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3. If a natal den is discovered between August 1 and November 30, a qualified Caltrans biologist shall immediately contact the United States Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) and no construction related activity shall occur within 1000-foot radius of the active natal/pupping den until authorized by USFWS and the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office.
4. If a natal/pupping den is discovered between December 1 and May 31, a qualified Caltrans biologist shall immediately contact the USFWS and no construction related activity shall occur within 1500-foot (0.3 mile) radius of the active natal/pupping den until authorized by USFWS and the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office
5. Under no circumstances should a den be disturbed or destroyed without prior authorization.
6. If work will occur within the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), a request must be submitted to the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office to have a qualified biologist conduct a pre-construction CHL and migratory bird survey within 14 days prior to activities that involve ground disturbance.
7. If an active nest is observed, a protective buffer shall be established around the nest until the young have fledged. No construction related activities shall occur within the limits of the protective buffer until authorized by the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office.
8. If approved, construction-related activities must begin within 14 days of survey completion. If contractors fail to begin construction within 14 days, or if activities begin but are delayed for more than 14 days, the biologist must perform another survey. Construction cannot recommence until authorized by the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office.

Within the entire project limit, implement the following protection measures:

9. Project-related vehicles should observe a daytime speed limit of 20-mph throughout the site in all project areas, except on county roads and State and Federal highways. Off-road traffic outside of designated project areas should be prohibited.
10. To prevent inadvertent entrapment of SJKF or other animals during the construction, all excavated, steep-walled holes or trenches more than 2-feet deep should be covered at the close of each working day by plywood or similar materials. If the trenches cannot be closed, one or more escape ramps constructed of earthen-fill or wooden planks shall be installed. Before such holes or trenches are filled, they should be thoroughly inspected for trapped animals. If at any time a trapped or injured SJKF is discovered, stop all work immediately and contact the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office for further instruction. No work shall continue until authorized by the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office or until the animal leaves the project limits on its own.



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11. No firearms shall be allowed at the project site.
12. No pets, such as dogs or cats, should be permitted on the project site.
13. Use of rodenticides or herbicides is not allowed.
14. Any contractor, employee, or agency personnel who inadvertently kills or injures a SJKF must immediately report the incident to the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office.

• Caltrans SSP 14-6.03A for pre-construction bird survey shall be included in the construction contract:

-If work will occur within the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), a request must be submitted to the Caltrans District 10 Environmental Office to have a qualified biologist conduct a pre-construction bird survey within 14 days prior to the start of any construction related activities. If an active nest is observed, a protective buffer shall be established around the nest until the young have fledged. No construction related activities shall occur within the limits of the protective buffer until authorized by the Caltrans District 10 Environmental Office. Once authorized, if construction activities do not commence within 14 days after completion of the bird survey or if construction activities stop for more than 14 days, a subsequent bird survey may be required. Work shall not commence or recommence until authorized by the Caltrans District 10 Environmental Office.

Hazardous Waste:

1. The Caltrans Standard Special Provision 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii), which pertains to Earth Material Containing Lead, shall be added to the construction contract. A Lead Compliance Plan prepared by a Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) is required and all soil must remain on-site.

No Permits Required
