Project Title: Waddell Reclamation Plan Amendment and Use Permit Amendment RP-01-01-1M and UP-19-74-1M

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project includes amending the existing Use Permit and Reclamation Plan to expand the quarry excavation area and allow continued mining activities at the site for an additional 30 years. The proposed project would allow for the continued removal, crushing and stockpiling of aggregate on site. Mining operations would continue Monday through Friday with no night, weekend, or holiday operations. Hours of operation will be 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Blasting will continue to occur every two to three years, in the late winter or early spring between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. The operations at this site will vary based on the need of the aggregate product produced at the site. It is estimated that approximately 250 truckloads of material will be transported from the site with an average of five loads per week. The APN's associated with this project are 009-340-350, 009-330-230 & 009-330-240.

Mitigation Measures related to Air Quality will help to decrease particulate matter emissions from dust within the expanded quarry area.

Mitigated Measures related to Biological Resources will help to decrease an adverse affect, either directly or through habitat modifications, on any species identified as a candidate, sensitive, or special status species in local or regional plans, policies, or regulations, or by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, or NOAA Fisheries.

Mitigation Measures related to Cultural Resources will help to mitigate any potential disturbance of cultural resources, should they be found.

Mitigation Measures related to Geology and Soils will reduce the risk of potential loss or injury due to ground disturbances.

Mitigation Measures related to Noise will reduce estimated noise levels to comply with standards at the closest residential property.

Mitigation Measures related to Transportation will reduce traffic hazards from trucks and equipment operated within and adjacent to the County Road.
