Project Description

Project Title: San Bernardino County Flood Control District: Deer Creek and Day Creek Access Roads

Project Location: The Access roads for San Bernardino County Flood Control Facilities, Deer Creek Channel and Day Creek Basin #1, are located north of Wilson Avenue, between Haven Avenue and Etiwanda Avenue, in the city of Rancho Cucamonga.

Project Description: Maintenance work includes restoring and maintaining existing access roads leading to the Deer Creek and Day Creek facilities to ensure safe and accessible passage for maintenance and emergency response vehicles. The project will restore the access roads to their original 10–12-foot width, by clearing and leveling the road surface. Equipment to be used includes a grader, dozer, water truck, loader, and dump truck. The work is expected to take approximately 30 working days to complete, ensuring the access roads are safe and functional for future flood control maintenance activities.
