Project Description: The abandonment of two existing production wells consists of removing equipment, cleaning out the wellbore, and plugging the wells with cement.

The proposed project consists of the California Department of Conservation, Geologic Energy Management Division (CalGEM) approving two permits for THUMS Long Beach Co. (T2900) to abandon two wells listed below, in the Wilmington Oil Field.

<p>CEQA Exceptions to the Exemptions (14 CCR § 15300.2): where project is located (e.g., sensitive environment); Cumulative Impact; Significant Effect due to Unusual Circumstances; Scenic Highways; Hazardous Waste Sites; Historical Resources.</p>				

Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The basis for CalGEM's determination that the project is exempt from the requirements of CEQA is provided in the brief explanation below.

Class 1, Existing Facilities (14 CCR §§ 15301, 1684.1): Class 1 applies to the "operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration" of existing facilities involving "negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing previously." (§ 1684.1) The proposed Project is to abandon two existing production wells in the Wilmington field. This proposal involves removing existing equipment, cleaning out the wells, and plugging with cement to abandon the two wells. The abandonments will use temporary equipment, such as a workover rig, confirmed to fit within the existing wellpad. This proposed Project is a minor alteration involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond previously existing.

Class 2, Replacement or Reconstruction (14 CCR § 15302): Class 2 applies because the rework of the well could be considered "replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity." This abandonment only involves reconstructing to abandon two existing production wells by

removing equipment, cleaning out the wells, and plugging with cement. The proposal does not involve any changes to the well's structures (the wellbores).

Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land (14 CCR §§ 15304, 1684.2): Class 4 applies because the rework "consists of drilling operations that result in only minor alterations with negligible or no permanent effects to the existing condition of the land, water, air, and/or vegetation." The abandon is intended to maintain the current level of service and will not involve expanding the facility or operations. The proposed activities and temporary equipment will be contained within the existing well pads. As a result, there will be no new ground disturbances. There are no expected impacts on biological resources as the proposed Project will not disturb undisturbed areas.

Exceptions to Exemptions: CalGEM further finds that there are no exceptions to the application of the categorical exemptions (PRC § 21084; 14 CCR § 15300.2) referenced above. For example, there is no substantial evidence that there are any "unusual circumstances" associated with the proposed project that create a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment, and that there are no significant "cumulative impacts" resulting from successive projects of the same type in the same place. Therefore, reliance on the exemptions is appropriate.
