Project Description: The project involves approval of a permit for a sublessee, Palomar Aviation LLC, to use a portion of McClellan-Palomar Airport, specifically Hangar 8, located at 2008 Palomar Airport Road, Carlsbad, CA 92008, to host an Airplane and Flight Training Open House event for current students, airplane owners, and customers. The event will provide a static display of airplanes, with discussions of flight training and airplane ownership. The event is restricted to activities (including set-up and cleanup) associated with the event. In accordance with the issued permit, authorized uses shall commence on the Effective Date as approved by County of San Diego, Airports Division.

This is to advise that the County of San Diego Department of Public Works (County decision-making body) has approved the above-described project on April 22, 2025 and found the project to be exempt from CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt: Section 15301 of the State CEQA Guidelines exempts the "operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use." The key consideration in applying this exemption is whether the proposed action involves expansion of an existing or former use. The proposed action consists of approval of the use of premises for a special event utilizing existing public airport structure and facilities. Issuance of the permit identified above will not result in an expansion of uses of existing facilities. Accordingly, the proposed action is exempt from CEQA review pursuant to Section 15301 of CEQA Guidelines.
