DESCRIPTION OF NATURE, PURPOSE AND BENEFICIARIES OF PROJECT: The City of Lakeport proposes the Martin & Lakeshore Repaving Project, which consists of pavement rehabilitation on Martin Street and Lakeshore Boulevard. The work includes full-depth reclamation with cement, hot mix asphalt paving, protection and adjustment of existing utilities, and restoration of pavement markings. All improvements will occur entirely within the existing public right-of-way.


