NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in compliance with Sections 15086 and 15087 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, to responsible agencies, trustee agencies, interested parties and the general public, that the Revised Draft Environmental Impact Report (RDEIR) for the Scott Ranch Project (formerly Davidon/Scott Ranch) is available for public review and comment.

PROJECT LOCATION: Northwest and southwest corners of Windsor Drive and D Street, Petaluma, Sonoma County, California. APN 019-120-040 and 019-120-041.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Scott Ranch project consists of a residential component and the Putnam Park Extension Project. The residential component proposes development on approximately 15 acres of the project site and includes 28 single-family residences, streets, common open space, and other infrastructure improvements including a roundabout at Windsor Dr./D Street, pedestrian and bicycle facilities, and sewer, water, and storm drainage facilities. The proposed Putnam Park Extension Project component proposes to extend the existing Helen Putnam Regional Park eastward to D Street by developing a park area on approximately 44-acres of the project site. The Putnam Park Extension portion of the project proposes development of a barn center that includes renovation of the existing barn complex and cleaning shed, installation of pathways, bicycle parking, information kiosks, vegetable gardens, demonstration and working corrals, antique farm equipment, and an amphitheater for outdoor learning activities. This project component includes a multi-use loop trail network of approximately one mile, north and south of Kelly Creek. A 300-foot Urban Separator will be maintained between the proposed development and the southern boundary of the project site. The project also includes the off-site Helen Putnam Regional Park Trail project; a 0.5-mile-long trail segment proposed by Sonoma County Regional Parks.

RDEIR DOCUMENT AVAILABILITY: The RDEIR is available for review in electronic format due to the closure of City Hall consistent with Executive Order No. N-29-20 from the Executive Department of the State of California and the Sonoma County Health Official Orders No. C19-03 and C19-05. RDEIR Documents can also be made available by appointment through the City of Petaluma Planning Division Office, 11 English Street, Petaluma, CA. Hard copies can be purchased at the City Planning Division for the City's cost of production.

REVIEW PERIOD: The City will accept public comments on the RDEIR for 60 days beginning December 31, 2020 and extending to March 1, 2021.

PUBLIC HEARING: The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on the RDEIR on **Tuesday, February 9, 2021** at 7:00 PM via teleconference. The City Council public hearing on the RDEIR is tentatively scheduled for March 1, 2021. The subsequent City Council hearing will be separately noticed.

MEETING LOCATION: Consistent with Executive Order No. N-29-20 from the Executive Department of the State of California and the Sonoma County Health Official Orders No. C19-03 and C19-05, the Planning Commission public hearing will not be physically open to the public and all Planning Commissioners will be teleconferencing into the meeting via Zoom.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN: The Planning Commission will receive a staff presentation, accept public comment, provide comments on the RDEIR, and forward a recommendation to the City Council.

HOW TO OBSERVE AND PARTICIPATE: Members of the public may participate and provide public comments to teleconference meetings as follows:

- Written public comments may be submitted by email to oervin@cityofpetaluma.org up to 2 hours prior to the meeting start (**February 9, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.**). Public comments will be provided to the Planning Commission and uploaded to the City's website in advance of the meeting.
- Oral public comments will be accepted through the teleconference meeting only. To address the Planning Commission during the live meeting, please find the meeting-specific link to the Zoom meeting included on the agenda for the February 9, 2021 Planning Commission meeting that will be posted on the City's website.
- All Planning Commission meetings are televised via Petaluma Community Access broadcasts on Comcast and Petaluma's local channels 26, 27, and 28. With AT&T U-Verse, PCA's channels are accessible through channel 099. Local channels are not currently available on Satellite/DISH Networks.
