Title: Suisun Marsh Habitat Management, Preservation, and Restoration

Applicant: Suisun Resource Conservation District

Location: Sovereign land in the Suisun Marsh, which is bounded to the west by Interstate 680, Highway 12 to the north, Shiloh Road and Collinsville Road to the east, and Suisun Bay to the south, in Solano County

Description: The Suisun Habitat Management, Preservation, and Restoration Plan is being pursued by the Suisun Principal Agencies, a group of agencies with primary responsibility for Suisun Marsh management, and is intended to balance the benefits of tidal wetland restoration with other habitat uses in the Marsh by evaluating alternatives that provide a politically acceptable change in Marshwide land uses. The State Lands Commission action is an approval of a 10-year General Lease – Dredging Lease through August 15, 2034.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on August 29, 2024, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, certified the EIR/Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and approved the project on December 11, 2011. The Commission has previously considered the EIR/EIS for this project and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program, which remains in full force. The EIR/EIS and the record of project approval may be examined at the above Commission Sacramento office address.
