Title: Cullinan Ranch Restoration Project

Applicant: U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

Location: Sovereign land located in the Napa River and Dutchman Slough, near Vallejo, Solano County

Description: The project consists of a 1,575-acre habitat enhancement and restoration at the Cullinan Ranch Restoration Project Site, a former tidal marsh adjacent to the Napa River Unit of the Napa-Sonoma Marshes Wildlife Area in San Pablo Bay and west of the City of Vallejo along Highway 37. The State Lands Commission action is a lease amendment to allow the construction, use, and maintenance of one additional temporary sediment offloading facility, installation of one additional dredged material slurry pipeline, and use of one additional work zone surrounding the temporary sediment offloading facility.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on April 4, 2024, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, certified the EIR/Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and approved the project on April 22, 2010. In 2012, the California State Lands Commission (Commission) adopted an Addendum to the EIR/EIS on May 24, 2012, to address any changes to the proposed Project. The Commission has previously considered the EIR/EIS and Addendum, as certified and adopted, respectively, for this project and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program incorporating the previous documents, which remains in full force. The EIR/EIS, Addendum, and the record of project approval may be examined at the above shown California State Lands Commission Sacramento office address.
