
Dear Ms. Beddow:

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) El Cajon Area recently received a Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for the Alpine Community Plan Update. The State Clearing House number is 2018081093. A review of the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for the Alpine Community Plan Update has raised several concerns. The proposed land use modifications could change the current allowable dwelling units from 4,065 to the proposed 6,078, or the maximum of 11,498 dwelling units. Additionally, the plan could increase the forecasted population of 35,918 to 41,535, or the maximum forecasted population of 56,657.

The Alpine Community Plan Update will likely result in an increase in several aspects of functions within the El Cajon Area, specifically related to Interstate 8, and the unincorporated roadways in and around the Alpine Community. The plan update will likely increase the number of calls into the CHP Border Communication Center, increase the number of calls for service within the CHP El Cajon Area, increase the amount of traffic enforcement by the CHP El Cajon within this geographical area of San Diego County necessary to protect life and property. Additionally, it will likely increase traffic within the geographical area of responsibility of the CHP El Cajon Area which would increase response times of CHP officers responding to calls for service in other geographical areas of San Diego County, and increase the amount of emergency services the CHP El Cajon Area provides within this area of San Diego County.
