Project Description: The proposed cultivation project described herein (Project) includes the cultivation of up to 10,000 square feet (SF) of outdoor mature canopy located in Trinity County on Assessor's Parcel Number (APN): 019-390-004-000. The applicant is seeking a Small Outdoor Cannabis Cultivation License from the County (CCL-833) and is also seeking an Adult-Use Small Outdoor Cannabis Cultivation License from the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC; LCA24-0000589). Cultivation activities will include approx. 7,938sqft of mature canopy in (162) 7'x7' mature outdoor canopy areas. Existing support infrastructure includes a permitted onsite groundwater well, a 2,500-gallon water storage tank, two (2) 250-gallon nutrient mixing tanks, a solar array, a 3.5'x4.25' petroleum storage box and, an 8'x20' container for processing and harvest storage. There is a permitted septic system onsite that services the project's wastewater needs. Power for the project is provided by solar array. Proposed activities include the installation of a 6'x100' hoop row for immature canopy, a 10'x12' shed for ag chemical storage, another 8'x20' shipping container for processing and harvest storage and a 10'x10' cannabis waste compost area on previously disturbed area with hand tools only. A more detailed project description can be found in the Appendix C Checklist.

The County finds that the adoption of the proposed project falls within the Trinity County Cannabis Program Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") (SCH# 2018122049). Certified by the Board of Supervisors on December 21, 2020 (Resolution 2020-103). Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14) Section 15168, the impacts associated with the proposed project were studied, and mitigation measures concerning such impacts were developed, in the Cannabis Program EIR.
