Project Description: The proposed cultivation project described herein (Project) is the continuation of existing cultivation activities located in Trinity County on Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 014-420-067-00. The applicant currently holds an Adult Use – Small Mixed-Light Cannabis Cultivation License from the California Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) (CCL20-0001113) and is applying for a cannabis cultivation license from the Trinity County Planning Department (CCL-547) to cultivate up to 10,000 square feet (sf) of mature mixed-light canopy. The existing cultivation currently includes four (4) greenhouses consisting of up to 10,000 sqft of mature cultivation; two (2) 30'x100' greenhouses (6,000 sqft), a 30'x90' greenhouse (2,700 sqft), and a 20'x65' greenhouse (1,300 sqft). The parcel is developed with one (1) single-family residence (occupied) (1200 sqft.), one (1) dirt/gravel road for access, one (1) barn/garage (600 sqft) that will be used for storage, a permitted septic system, two (2) domestic wells and four (4) water tanks each with a 2,500 holding capacity. Two (2) 8'x40' (320 sqft) shipping containers are used for storage for cannabis cultivation supplies. The greenhouses were constructed using minimal heavy equipment. The lower and upper cultivation areas are already cleared and graded. No additional clearing is proposed. A more detailed project description can be found in the Appendix C Checklist.



The County finds that the adoption of the proposed project falls within the Trinity County Cannabis Program Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") (SCH# 2018122049). Certified by the Board of Supervisors on December 21, 2020 (Resolution 2020-103). Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14) Section 15168, the impacts associated with the proposed project were studied, and mitigation measures concerning such impacts were developed, in the Cannabis Program EIR.
