The proposed cultivation project described herein (Project) includes the cultivation of up to 5,000 square feet (SF) of mixed-light located in Trinity County on Assessor's Parcel Number (APN): 016-200-010-00. The applicant is seeking a Specialty Mixed-Light Cannabis Cultivation License from the County (CCL-558) and holds an Adult-Use Specialty Mixed-Light Tier 1 Cannabis Cultivation License from the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC; 016-200-010-00, Expires on 2023-07-15). Cultivation activities include two (2) 30' x 84' greenhouses for immature canopy that will become mature canopy and two (2) proposed 30' x 84' greenhouses for immature canopy that will become mature canopy. Other supporting structures include a 4' x 10' cannabis waste area for composting; a 10' x 12' shed for agricultural chemical and pesticide storage; three (3) 8' x 42' trailers for processing and harvest storage; two (2) 1,000-gallon and two (2) 5,000-gallon water storage tanks. The project proposes the installation of a locking gate to the cultivation area. Water for this project will be served through a permitted well, energy will be provided through TPUD, and a permitted septic will be used for the project's wastewater needs.

SPECIAL NOTES: Applicant has provided supplemental Odor, Noise, and Light Attenuation Plan to fall in compliance with: Resolution NO. 2023-071, "A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of The County of Trinity allowing streamlined approval of cannabis licenses that require CCV's for the calendar year 2023".

The County finds that the adoption of the proposed project falls within the Trinity County Cannabis Program Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") (SCH# 2018122049). Certified by the Board of Supervisors on December 21, 2020 (Resolution 2020-103). Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14) Section 15168, the impacts associated with the proposed project were studied, and mitigation measures concerning such impacts were developed, in the Cannabis Program EIR.
