**Project Location (Trinity):** The project is located at Duncan Creek, tributary to Carr Creek, in the County of Trinity, State of California; 40.578132°N,123.082292°W, 421 Summit Creek Road in Hayfork, CA; Assessor's Parcel Number 015-270-36-00.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement 1600-2019-0831-R1, pursuant to Fish and Game Code section 1602, to the project Applicant, Valentin Ivanov, representing Corona Project, LLC.

The project is limited to diversion of surface water from Duncan Creek for both commercial cannabis cultivation and domestic purposes. This Agreement allows for surface water diversion from the existing 12-foot wide by 18-foot long cement cistern located within 20 feet of the channel. Water is pumped using a submersible ½-horsepower pump from the bottom of the 10-foot deep cement casing to a 200,000 gallon off-stream storage pond using a 1-inch black poly pipe. Water will be diverted and stored according to Small Irrigation Use Registration #H508536. The seep well may be maintained in its current state, including repairs within the casing structure, but this Agreement does not authorize expanding the capacity by digging it deeper or wider. This Agreement does not authorize any in-channel manipulation.

This is to advise that CDFW, acting as a Responsible Agency, approved the project described above on January 23, 2024 and has made the following determinations

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regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i):

- The project will not have a significant effect on the environment. This
  determination is limited to effects within CDFW's permitting jurisdiction as a
  Responsible Agency.
