Project Description: The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), pursuant to authority granted under California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 20 is approving an Addendum to a previously certified Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for Temporary Authorization to facilitate timely implementation of closure or corrective action activities for Tank 55001 and recommence using associated tanks for the storage and treatment of used oil, waste oil, and recovered oil at Demenno-Kerdoon, dba World Oil Recycling (D-K Compton). DTSC prepared an Addendum pursuant to a previously certified 2000 EIR to evaluate activities associated with the Temporary Authorization request. The Temporary Authorization will permit D-K Compton to clean out Tank 55001 per requirements under Section 66270.42(e)(3)(c)(1), to facilitate timely implementation of closure or corrective action activities. The Permit does not include any changes in operations or ground disturbing activities. D-K Compton is located at 2000 North Alameda Street in Compton, California 90222.

Background: D-K Compton is a hazardous waste storage, treatment, and transfer facility and used oil recycling facility located within Los Angeles County. The hazardous waste accepted at the facility are received from sources such as spill cleanups, service stations, oil change businesses, community recycling, and used oil collection centers. Hazardous waste is accepted in containers/drums, such as 55-gallon drums and roll-off bins, and in bulk from tanker trucks or vacuum trucks. Bulk hazardous wastes received in tanker trucks or vacuum trucks are unloaded in the following designated unloading/loading areas, referred to as racks. The racks consist of pumps, hoses, filters (strainers), and piping for unloading bulk loads of hazardous waste to permitted/authorized units. The pumps are

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equipped with basket strainers on their suction side to remove large solids. The facility mainly conducts storage and treatment of used oil, waste oil, oily water, and used antifreeze, and storage and treatment, including blending, of hazardous waste (RCRA Fuel) for shipment to an authorized off-site disposal facility.

DTSC pursuant to authority granted under California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 20, is reviewing a request for Temporary Authorization to facilitate timely implementation of closure or corrective action activities for Tank 55001 at the D-K Compton facility and not to exceed 180 days. The facility applied for Temporary Authorization per Title 22, CCR 66270.42(e) to modify the upcoming clean out of Tank 55001, which is scheduled to start January 2025 and meet requirements under 66270.42(e)(3)(c)(1), to facilitate timely implementation of closure or corrective action activities. Tank 55001 is a 2.31-million-gallon storage tank used for the storage of used oil and waste oil received from the Unloading Rack area. Tanks 526, 528, 530, and 532 are used to receive, store, and treat used oil, waste oil, recycled oil, exempt oil, and the storage and treatment of intermediate waste stream and recovered oil. During the clean out of Tank 55001, the primary services for Tanks 526, 528, 530, and 532 will be to store and treat intermediate waste stream and intermediate stream water. Skim points and lines will be added to Tanks 526, 528, 530, and 532 to increase the efficiency of treating the volume of waste during the Tank 55001 clean out. The added skim points and lines will remain in place after cleaning out of Tank 55001 is complete. These tanks will return to their current service for the storage and treatment of used oil, waste oil, and recovered oil.

D-K Compton was issued an Interim Status Document (ISD) in August 1983 by the California Department of Health Services (predecessor to DTSC). The facility was issued their first Hazardous Waste Facility Permit (Permit) by DTSC on July 6, 2001. The Permit was renewed by DTSC and made effective on January 17, 2017, and had an expiration date of July 1, 2003. DTSC circulated an EIR (State Clearinghouse Number 1995031067) for public comment in September of 2000 and filed a Notice of Determination (State Clearinghouse Number 1995031067) in July of 2001 for issuance of the initial Permit. This Addendum is to the previously certified EIR and has been prepared to address activities associated with the Temporary Authorization request and to amend the analysis of the previously adopted 2000 EIR due to updates to the CEQA Guidelines, not as a result of project changes.

The Temporary Authorization will authorize D-K Compton to facilitate timely implementation of closure or corrective action activities for Tank 55001. All operating activities of the facility will continue as previously approved. This Temporary Authorization does not include any ground disturbing activities or operational changes, and all previous Permit requirements will remain in effect. This Temporary

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Authorization will not result in any new or substantially more severe significant impacts on the environment.

As Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), DTSC approved the above-described project on December 12, 2024, and has made the following determinations:

1. The project will not have a significant effect on the environment.
2. An Environmental Impact Report was prepared for this project pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
3. Mitigation measures were not made a condition of project approval by DTSC.
4. A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was not adopted for this project by DTSC.
5. A Statement of Overriding Considerations was not adopted for this project by DTSC.
6. Findings were made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA by DTSC.
