Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District is proposing to implement measures to provide 100-year level of flood protection in the City of Napa north of the bypass (Increment 2), as part of the USACE Authorized Napa River/Napa Creek Flood Protection Project. The Increment 2, North of the Bypass, flood protection measures consist of four elements: floodwalls south of Lincoln Avenue, floodwalls north of Lincoln Avenue, scour protection under the Lincoln Avenue bridge, and two short floodwall closures at the dry bypass. Construction of these flood protection measures would occur on the west bank of the Napa River and under the Lincoln Avenue Bridge.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Significant and unavoidable impacts are anticipated for Cultural Resources, Noise and Vibration, and Tribal Cultural Resources.

Mitigation measures are proposed to avoid and/or minimize impacts to Air Quality, Cultural Resources, Fisheries and Aquatic Biological Resources, Geology and Soils, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, Noise and Vibration, Terrestrial Biological Resources, Traffic and Transportation, and Tribal Cultural Resources.

If applicable, describe any of the project's areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency, including issues raised by agencies and the public.

There are currently no areas of communicated controversy related to the Proposed Project or identified in the SEIR scoping process.

Provide a list of the responsible or trustee agencies for the project.

The City of Napa is considered a Responsible Agency under CEQA based on their discretionary approval power over some aspects of the Proposed Project and would consider use of this SEIR for their CEQA compliance.
