Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Zone Change #17-0006 consists of rezoning an approximately 160-acre parcel from A-2-R (General Agricultural/Rural Zone) to A-3 (Heavy Agricultural), submitted by Moiola Bros. Cattle Feeders, with the intent to expand their existing feedlot operations, which are north of the project site. The applicant intends to add up to 18,000 head of cattle on the project site.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The IS/MND identifies issues with Air Quality, Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Transportation. Studies were requested from the applicant and some mitigation measures were included in those studies. They were made part of the Environmental Evaluation Committee package. These mitigation measures include: using paved roads only, for the operator shall follow the standard mitigation measures for Fugitive PM10 control, reducing emissions of VOC and NH3 to the extent feasible and basing GHG reduction measures upon Air Pollution Control District's Rule 217 requirements.

Issues may arise from complaints related to odor, increase in traffic and rules for leafy green requirements on surrounding agricultural parcels.
